PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Thanking My Predecessor

Before looking to the future, I would be remiss if I did not extend copious thanks to my predecessor, Mitch Cipriano. During Mitch's tenure as HOA Board President, the facilities continued to undergo significant improvement: the bathroom upgrades were completed; the bocce ball courts were installed; new, upgraded basketball backboards were installed; the by-laws were revised to reflect current law. We get many compliments on the appearance of the club, as evidenced by the fact that realtors first drive by the club to introduce the neighborhood to potential buyers. Looking to the Future

Mitch left things in such good shape that my number one priority for 2018 is not to mess anything up! Speaking metaphorically, the ship is in great shape and pointed in the right direction. As a result, 80% of this year's Board efforts will be spent keeping things moving forward accordingly.

As to the other 20%, I see two main areas for improvement:

- Facilities Scheduling—Many of you book the facilities for your own events. Walking or driving (or running) by the club throughout the year, I've seen many birthday parties, wedding receptions, graduation parties, and other member-sponsored happenings at the club. This year, the Board is investigating options for improving the facilities booking process. Keep in mind that our club is relatively small, with limited revenues, so there are financial limits to what can be done. However, your Board understands that the world has moved to the Web as the go-to place for this sort of service. Consider 2018 the Alpha and Beta test year for various options. Realistically, the earliest anything would be available for general usage would be in 2019. (Of course, if someone would like to see this happen sooner, and they have the skills to make it happen, we are open to volunteers!)
- Activities—Our club hosts many activities, mostly serving children and their families during the summer months. Your Board is interested in assessing whether the general membership would like to see more activities, especially throughout the year, with some specifically targeting adults: book club, bocce ball tournaments, wine tasting, Foreign Film Night, etc. We also want to assess in the general membership's interest in resurrecting the Halloween Party. Last year was the first year in several that we could not find anyone to volunteer to lead the Halloween Party effort. Has interest waned, are people just too busy, or is it something else? Within the next few months, your Board plans to conduct a survey of the general membership regarding club activities.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As we head into spring, I'm still trying to figure out what happened to winter. I've spent much more time on my mountain bike than on skis this year. Hopefully we'll get some much-needed rain soon to bring greenery to Belwood this spring.

2017 in Review

We closed 2017 fairly close to expectations. Our revenue was 5% higher than budget, driven by higher key fees, swim team charges and transfer charges on home sales. Expenses were 1% over budget. While there were a number of variations overall with expected individual expenses, we were able to stay fairly close to budget. The overall net income was 27% higher than anticipated, which allowed us to contribute \$30K to our reserve fund and still have ample operating cash for the start of January. Our balance sheet remains strong, with approximately \$186K in reserves and \$15K in cash at the end of 2017. We only spent \$2,400 in reserves for the year as we were able to defer some expected projects as they were not necessary in the calendar year. While regular maintenance is crucial to protecting our investment, if something we expected to replace is still usable we usually opt to wait.

Impact of 7 Board Members

For 2018, per the new By-Laws we now only have 7 board members, down from 9 authorized previously. Luckily, we have 7 residents willing to run for the board so we have no vacancies. Many years we were unable to field 9 candidates, so the impact is expected to be minimal. For various reasons, we restrict who can be an officer on the board (i.e. President, Secretary, etc.). This disqualified three of our directors from running for an office, and almost led us to an interesting constitutional situation. Our by-laws require 4 officers, but we can't have an officer serve two positions (i.e. be Vice President and Treasurer). Hence, we need to make sure going forward that we have enough eligible officers on the board.

Insurance Review

As you'll read elsewhere in this issue, we tackled our insurance in 2017 as well. We wound up having to change agents, but have updated policies and expect to save about 10-15% over our previous policies with improved coverage. A lot of hard work went into this, but we'll be better off overall with the changes we made, in addition to being money ahead.

Annual HOA Member Meeting

For those who regularly attend our annual HOA member meeting in May, please note that we have eliminated that. You are free to show up and enjoy our board meeting, but we won't have a specific member meeting. Truth be told, we seldom had anyone show up and this will simplify work required by board members. Everything we would present is found in the annual mailing you receive in the fall, so members evidently did not feel the need to show up. BUT, every month our board meeting has a Homeowners Forum so if you ever want to drop in and speak your mind, or to ask questions of the board, you have twelve other opportunities each year to say hello.

The Board is anticipating more comprehensive and efficient insurance coverage at a lower cost by coordinating all of the HOA insurance products.

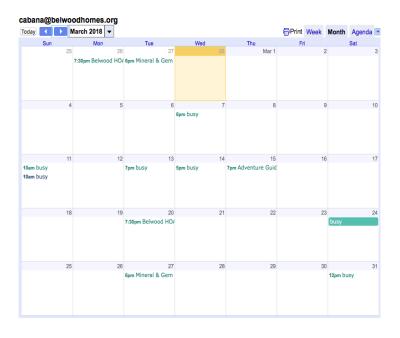

What's the number one question that is asked by residents who want to rent?

"Is my party date available?"



Yup, a call gets made or an email gets sent, asking this very question. And your board heard you loudly, and we now have the answer to your question before you even ask it. Some new magical, shiny thing? An augmented reality headset that can read your brain waves? Almost but not quite.

Using the technology our friends here in Silicon Valley developed, we now have a dedicated calendar on the website that lists all of the events we have going on. Want to know if someone else is having a birthday party at the cabana the same day you are? Just check the calendar. Want to know if there's a swim meet before you invite your relatives over for a picnic and bocce ball tournament? Just check the calendar.

Our facility manager Gina Wagner has put everything online, so before you call or email you know if something's going on. All of the 'public' events such as board meetings, swim team events and certain groups are listed on the calendar. An Artist Among Us

Claudia is a renowned recorder player known for her virtuosity and expressiveness. She spent more than twelve years of her professional career playing in Europe as a soloist and as a founding member of several ensembles.

Later in her career, she moved to Colombia, her country of origin, where she contributed to the Early Music program for the National University. While in Colombia, she also founded the early music ensemble Esfera Armoniosa in Bogota. The group won the highest price for music ensembles in Colombia and toured around the country bringing their talent to eight different cities and developing the "Io vo Cantar" CD in 2011. After four years in her native Colombia, Claudia moved to the United States with her family. She lives in the South Bay area in our Belwood – Belgatos neighborhood where she maintains an active role participating in many concerts and activities with regional and local ensembles and early music groups.

Claudia holds a Master of Arts in Recorder Performance from the Conservatory of Music in Geneva, Switzerland (2004). She performed and taught in Europe, US and South America and has recorded with the Ensemble Elyma (Switzerland, 1997), Musica ficta (Colombia, 2007), Esfera Armoniosa; (Colombia, 2009, 2015).

After moving to the USA in 2009, she collaborated in the Early Music program at the Palm Beach Atlantic University in Florida.



In California, she has been a guest conductor at several Recorder Workshops, has served as a member of the faculty of the SFEMS Recorder Workshop, and has played recently with the California Bach Society, the American Bach Soloists, and the Farallon Recorder Quartet.

Claudia is very happy to announce that her group "La Esfera Armoniosa" just published its new CD, "¡Que Dulce Violencia!" in December 2016. This is a very special CD and the product of a great deal of work to bring excellent baroque music to all the people that love early music. Through this CD, she states "we bring alive some beautiful pieces representative of the influence that the Spanish baroque music had all over Europe and in the Spanish colonies in the Americas". Claudia teaches piano, recorder, ear training and music theory to her students preparing them for the ABRSM test.

Spring-Vegetable Paella

You don't need a paella pan to make paella; any large frying pan will do. Serve this paella hot or at room temperature (as it is often eaten in Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup drained sliced jarred pimientos, chopped (one 4-ounce jar)
- 1 tomato, peeled and chopped
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 1/4 teaspoons salt
- 1/4 teaspoon turmeric
- 2 cups rice, preferably medium-grain such as arborio
- 3 cups canned low-sodium chicken broth or homemade stock
- 1 cup water
- 1/2 cup chopped flat-leaf parsley
- 1/2 pound asparagus, tough ends snapped off and discarded, spears cut into 2-inch pieces
- 1 cup frozen peas
- 1 6 1/2-ounce jar marinated artichoke hearts, drained and sliced
- 2 cups drained and rinsed canned cannellini beans (one 19-ounce can)

Spain), as is or topped with toasted sliced almonds.



How to Make It

Step 1

In a large frying pan, heat the oil over moderately low heat. Add the onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until translucent, about 5 minutes. Add the pimientos, tomato, and garlic and cook, stirring occasionally, for 2 minutes.

Step 2

Stir in the salt, turmeric, and rice. Add the chicken broth, water, and parsley and bring to a boil.

Continue cooking over moderate heat, stirring frequently, until most of the liquid has been absorbed by the rice, about 7 minutes.

Step 3

Stir in the asparagus, peas, artichokes, and beans. Reduce the heat and simmer, covered, for 15 minutes. Remove from the heat and let stand, covered, for 10 minutes before serving.

Suggested Pairing

Sauvignon Blanc is almost alone in its ability to match both artichokes and asparagus, two normally troubling foods for wines. Pungent, yet balanced, a Sauvignon Blanc from New Zealand is what you want here.
